# THE 1 SCHOOL STREET PROJECT by Sean Minear

About a year and a half ago, on April 22nd of 2019, the Weld General Store was lost to a fire. The building had historic significance for several reasons. Built in the 1830s, it is believed that the property was the oldest two-story structure in Weld. It is also believed that the building, which had housed a store of some type from its construction, was the oldest continuous business in all of Franklin County. For close to two centuries, this enterprise was a vital part of our town and still today, it is impossible to come to a stop in the center of Weld without recalling what was once there.

The Weld General Store played a significant role for many Kawanhee campers over the 100 years of this camp's history. For many years, Kawanhee boys walked to the village on Sunday afternoons to purchase penny candy. In later years, pizzas from the store were a vital part of lodge parties. There were many phone calls and emails after the loss of the store, expressing shock and sadness regarding the fire. Many Kawanhee individuals reached out, inquiring about plans for the location.


Dot and Jerry Nering this past spring made the decision to sell the Weld General Store corner lot, located at 1 School Street. After much discussion, the Board of Directors of the Weld Historical Society agreed that we should acquire this property. On June 5th, we signed a deed that grants ownership of the corner to the Weld Historical Society. We are looking at this opportunity in phases. Phase 1 was to obtain the property. Phase 2 will involve landscaping the area; bringing in loam, leveling the space and seeding it. Phase 3 will include developing a plan for the use of the space.

Our plan will be to create a welcoming space at the crossroads. We foresee the establishment of a committee which will solicit community input as to how best to use this area. Again, no decisions have been formalized as to what, if anything, will be placed on the space. Many ideas have been proposed.

The Society is looking to raise, through contributions and grants, \$60,000 to both improve the former Weld General Store lot and replenish the significant amount spent to acquire the space. We thank in advance all members of the Kawanhee family for their financial encouragement. A number of you have already made significant donations to this project and for that the Weld Historical Society is very grateful. For generations to come, this historic site will be preserved and celebrated because of your generous gifts.




# BEN SMITH Los Angeles, CA: 2003-2012

- A message I'd like to share with the CK family: Kawanhee changed me forever - for the better!





# THE ARC OF A (VIRTUAL) CAMP SEASON by Sam Reynolds

Summers at Kawanhee have arcs. Generally, we tend to remember the good times - sublime moments of peace by the lake, outrageous moments in your lodge among friends, deep feeling of pride after winning a baseball game as a team. Camp provides moments like this every day, in abundance. But spending seven weeks at camp, we should not forget, and often do, that sometimes there are lulls.

Perhaps it rained all of week 3 and time moved a bit slower, and your energy was a bit lower. Perhaps you had a small argument with your friend or didn't feel motivated to do much for a few days. Maybe you just missed your parents. Camp provides us lifelong memories of happiness. But it also teaches us how to cope with boredom, find something within ourselves to make the best of rainy days, and how to deal with the lulls - whether it's embracing or battling.

Beginning the summer of 2020, I, like many, found myself in a lull. I was unemployed, battling anxiety, and saw little more than dread in the future and even more so in the present. But in the lowest of points, Kawanhee has this miraculous tendency to extend a gracious hand and somehow pull you to your feet. That hand came in the form of a phone call from Graham Marvin, asking if I'd like to work on a video series for camp in the wake of the 2020 shutdown. I can say without a doubt that getting the chance to make these videos with Graham, Camille, Eli and the hundreds of people from the extended Kawanhee Family saved me more than once this summer.

Making these videos was the first time that working for Kawanhee felt like "work". Every Monday, Graham, Eli, Camille and I would connect on Zoom to discuss plans for the week's video. Eli and Camille would collaborate and help that week's host and guests, Graham oversaw, scheduled, and brainstormed the layout for every video, and I would receive all the footage and put it together. Every video took roughly 3 full workdays to conceptualize and assemble. Once a rough cut was made, Graham and I would pass the edit back and forth and exchange notes until the episode was fine-tuned. Graham and I spent hours tinkering every video - there are miles and miles of text scroll containing edit recommendations, stupid inside jokes, stressed out demands to find songs that fit for each segment. The text now serves as documented evidence of the weird little worlds camp creates between friends.

The result was an 8 episode mini-series, each video roughly 30-minutes-long. We hope it captures some of the arc of a camp season that didn't get to be. Like the first week of camp - the first video strikes me as a bit awkward and nervous with excitement. To be quite honest, I don't think any of us knew what we were making until the rough cut miraculously came to be, and it actually felt like... something. The feeling wasn't dissimilar to being a camp counselor and finding that, all of a sudden, your group of campers became a mini-family at some unidentifiable point. The next 7 weeks of videos represent the highs and lows of a camp season - the goofy jokes, the sporadic energy, the challenges we have to overcome together.

It was a joy to watch hundreds of people work to stay connected and keep the Kawanhee spirit alive from their homes. They gave me a chance to grow as an editor in a time when it's difficult to find work as a creative. They gave me an inspiring team of friends to collaborate with and confide in, week after week. They gave me a purpose and drive. Every portion of each video contains a little story or moment that reminds me the ways camp brings people together. They gave me the arc of a camp season.

The work transported me to the shores of Weld again, where I got to experience the soaring highs and those lulls you find yourself working through. I hope these videos were able to give something to camp, too. I don't think we can ever give back proportionally to this place that has provided so much, but I hope they were something. I know they were for me.





And if I couldn't accomplish those small goals, it was worth doing the project to just learn more about Kawanhee history. But, Steve and Diana have encouraged all of us to broaden our goals and hopefully publish it in book form!

I'm almost done with the manuscript and it is over 200 pages. But a lot still to do. We are calling the project "Among the Pines - The Story of Camp Kawanhee." So stay tuned. A real published history of Camp Kawanhee may soon be a reality.


