The Flying Deer Lodge of 1921 -- the only time in Kawanhee history that campers lived in the dining hall

In 1921, 16 campers arrived at Camp Kawanhee. It would the first camper summer in Kawanhee's history. The previous winter, a local crew from Weld had built three buildings: A huge Main Lodge/Dining Lodge, Eagle Lodge and Falcon Lodge (sadly, all three were lost in the 1977 fire). Besides the three buildings, an athletic field had been created out of a potato field, and boats had been purchased for waterfront activities. There was no camp vehicle so there would be no trips. But, Kawanhee had a start.

George and Raymond Frank had hoped to recruit about 30-35 campers but with no reputation and little advertising only 16 boys signed up. The 16 campers were separated into three cabin groups. Two of the lodge groups were housed in the newly built Eagle and Falcon cabins. It was decided to house a third group of boys in the upstairs of the Main Lodge/Dining Hall.

The Main Lodge/Dining Hall was the shining diamond of the three new buildings. It was a large structure with a dining hall on the ground floor. The second floor included a small area for reading and games (the Rec Hall would not be built until 1924-1925). A large stone fireplace provided great heat on both floors on chilly days. There was a collection of bedrooms upstairs, which were used to house a small group of campers in 1921. A few of the upstairs rooms would also house parents who came to visit, as the Kawanhee Inn was about 8 years in the future

It had been decided that the youngest boys would live in the Main Lodge. The lodge was named Flying Deer. No records exist of how they came up with the name. I'm still looking for a Flying Deer. The Flying Deer Lodge also had a unique counselor. Their leader was George and Raymond's mother, Abby Frank, but everyone knew her as Ma Frank. This technically makes her the only female lodge counselor in Kawanhee history!

1921 would be the only summer in Kawanhee's history that campers would live as a lodge group in the Dining Hall. By the season of 1922, another cabin had been built next to Falcon, called Panther. Panther is now Eagle Lodge, and is the oldest lodge cabin on Kawanhee's property. Other cabins would be built in the early 1920s and the Dining Hall was no longer needed as a place to house campers.

Kawanhee's Centennial Campaign

CK could use your support!

Much of Kawanhee's sustained success is due to the generosity of its alumni and supporters over the last one hundred years. Please consider donating to the George and Raymond Frank Foundation as a part of Kawanhee's ongoing **Centennial Campaign**, where we hope to raise \$750,000 to kick off the next century! The goals of the Centennial Campaign are to complete the renovation of the Rec Hall Complex, grow Kawanhee's endowment, and to expand Kawanhee's scholarship program.

We have completed the first phase of the **Rec Hall complex renovation project** and it is ready to welcome campers in 2021! In addition to expanding the existing facility, we are planning to build a new pavilion behind the Rec Hall. The pavilion will provide us with an open-air space to host all-camp gatherings and to hold activities on rainy days.

During the last year, we have seen the importance of having a **strong endowment**. To that end, we hope to grow our endowment in order to help with the preservation of camp property, to underwrite new programming, and to serve as a buffer during tough economic times. A healthy endowment allows us to be prepared for unpredictable events, and ensures that Kawanhee's second century is as great as its first.

Our third goal is to increase our **scholarship fund**. Over time, we have been fortunate enough to share the Kawanhee experience with many boys whose families may not have otherwise been able to afford Camp. A diverse Camp population benefits all campers, and we want to make this life-changing opportunity more widely available.


